
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1. THE MOUNTAIN WITH THE BEST SALES ARGUMENTS




The list of arguments for a visit to Mt. Pilatus is long. Just getting there is amazing, but the restaurants are a persuasive reason along with the panoramic views, which are in a league of their own.

1.1 THE GOLDEN ROUND TRIP





The «Golden Round Trip» tour takes you via the Panorama Gondolas, the aerial cableway «Dragon Ride», cogwheel railway and ship to the the most spectacular spots at Mt. Pilatus as well as to the summit. This round trip tour will show you the amazing variety of Lucerne's local mountain.

IN BRIEF:

- The starting point for the «Golden Round Trip» tour is right in the heart of Switzerland, in Lucerne.
- Take Bus No. 1 directly from the train station to Kriens. It takes about 15 minutes.
- Get off at the bus stop «Kriens, Zentrum Pilatus» and walk to the valley station. It takes about 10 minutes by foot.
- Take the Panorama Gondolas via Krienseregg up to Fräkmüntegg. It takes 30 minutes. Capacity is 4 people per gondola and it runs all year long"? (except during maintenance).
- Continue on the aerial cableway «Dragon Ride» to Pilatus Kulm. The ride takes around 5 minutes and the cableway departs every 15 minutes. Capacity is 55 guests and it runs all year long (except during maintenance).
- The large sunny terrace is superb to enjoy the breathtaking panorama, views of the alpine massif and delicious meals from a diverse range of food offers.
- Ride the steepest cogwheel railway in the world from Pilatus Kulm to Alpnachstad. The descent takes about 28 minutes (the ascent takes 19 minutes). Every railcar has capacity for 48 guests and the maximum capacity per ride is 188 passengers. The cogwheel railway leaves every 35 minutes.
- Take the ship from Alpnachstad to Lucerne on Lake Lucerne which takes around 50-90 minutes.
- The round trip can also be easily done in the opposite direction.

1.2 THE SILVER ROUND TRIP



The «Silver Round Trip» is as diverse as Mt. Pilatus itself. Take the Panorama Gondolas, the aerial cableway «Dragon Ride», the cogwheel railway and the train to discover all of the facets of Lucerne's local mountain.


IN BRIEF:

- Route is similar to the «Golden Round Trip».
- Instead of taking the ship you travel by train (Zentralbahn) from Alpnachstad to Lucerne. It is a 20-minute ride.
- The round trip can also be easily done in the opposite direction.

- From mid-May to mid-November
- Full-day or half-day excursions
- Available as a group trip
- Reservations for groups are mandatory and can be done via info@pilatus.ch or +41 (0)41 329 11 11

2. REDESIGN OF THE COGWHEEL RAILWAY



PILATUS-BAHNEN AG has invested 55 millions to continue operations on the «dragon mountain» for the next 40 years. From summer 2023, eight new railcars transport the guests on the original route of the world's steepest coghweel railway. The timeless, first-class design of the trains with 360-degree panoramic windows make the ride up Lucerne's local mountain even more exhilarating. An innovative control system and other technical innovations ensure greater comfort and a more sustainable operation.

IN BRIEF:

- In the new railcars, maximally large glass fronts provide a 360-degree panoramic view and an even more spectacular experience
- The new railcars operate in double traction.
- A second platform was built in Alphachstad. This allows passengers to board the eight railcars at the same time without additional shunting.
- Boarding and alighting is possible on both sides of the railcars.
- Thanks to a new lift and a widened waiting hall, the Pilatus Kulm mountain station meets the latest standards for accessible travel.

- Route: Alpnachstad Pilatus Kulm (commissioned 1889)
- Height difference: 1635 m
- Length of railway line: 4618 m
- Ascent: 19 min (previously 30 min); max. 15 km/h (previously max. 12 km/h)

- Frequency (new): every 35 min
- Operating time (season): May to November
- Rolling stock (new): 8 passenger railcars in double traction for 48 passengers each. Maximum capacity per ride: 188 passengers.





4.1 RESTAURANT PILATUS-KULM

Guests have been enchanted by the Restaurant Pilatus-Kulm since its opening in 1890. Just like back then, the unique ambiance at 2,132 meters will be dazzle you. The seasonal menu primarily features dishes made from fresh regional ingredients. The diverse spaces are exceptionally suited for banquets and comfortable meals.

IN BRIEF:

- The Queen Victoria Hall from the Belle Epoque was built in 1890 and seats up to 130 guests
- The Cheminée Saal has a pleasant charm with space for up to 60 guests
- The Dohlenstübli has a cosy ambiance with space for up to 30 guests
- Sun terrace with expansive views of the Alps and space for 150 guests
- Authentic regional and seasonal cuisine
- À la carte service

- On top of Mt. Pilatus at 2,132 meters above sea level
- Reservations recommended. No bookings possible on the terrace.





4.2 RESTAURANT BELLEVUE

This stylish self-service restaurant offers traditional Swiss dishes and international delicacies along with salads and desserts.

IN BRIEF:

- Bright and appealing restaurant with seating for up to 160 guests
- Outdoor seating with views of the Alps and seating for up to 200 guests
- Swiss and international dishes
- Self-service buffet restaurant

- On top of Mt. Pilatus at 2,132 meters above sea level
- No reservations possible







4.3 IBEX BAR AND PANORAMA GRILL

The Ibex Bar has a large drinks and snack offering and is located in the Panorama Gallery. In summer, the Panorama Grill is also open on the roof of the Panorama Gallery.

4.4 RESTAURANT FRÄKMÜNTEGG

Wood and stone define the style of this self-service restaurant that celebrates Swiss cuisine. A variety of different «Röstis» (hash browns), fresh salads from the buffet, homemade cakes with fresh fruit, and delicious desserts round off the tasty assortment.

IN BRIEF:

- Restaurant with large panorama windows and seating for up to 120 guests
- Terrace with stellar views of the mountains and the rope park, with seating for up to 120 guests
- Pre-orders available for groups, serving main courses and «Tatarenhut» (meat) experience
- Authentic Swiss cuisine including Rösti specialities
- Self-service buffet restaurant

- Located at Fräkmüntegg middle station
- No reservations possible
- Closed during the maintenance work on the gondolas







4.5 RESTAURANT KRIENSEREGG

The family-friendly restaurant Krienseregg serves Pinsa (special kind of Pizza) and regional Pasta. The self-service restaurant is located right next to the middle station and the PILU-Land playground - ideal for an excursion with children.

IN BRIEF:

- Cosy restaurant with seating for up to 54 guests
- Terrace views of Mt. Pilatus with seating for up to 80 guests
- The adventure playground PILU-Land (free of charge) is below the restaurant
- Pinsa (special kind of Pizza) and regional Pasta

4.6 RESTAURANT CHALET



5.1 SUMMER ACTIVITIES

Mt. Pilatus is an adventure mountain. Especially in summer, there are plenty of ways to discover the mountain. Exciting activities allow visitors to dive into the fascinating world of Mt. Pilatus.

5.1.1 SUMMER ACTIVITIES ON PILATUS KULM

- View from sun terrace or panorama gallery: If you're not up to hike much but want to get this unforgettable view anyway, head up to the sun terrace or sit down in the panorama gallery.
- **Viewpoint Oberhaupt:** When arriving at Pilatus Kulm it's only a 10-minute walk away: Viewpoint «Oberhaupt». Perfect for those who want to take some great photos quickly.
- **Viewpoint Esel:** The «Esel» is a little more challenging to climb. It takes about 15 minutes to reach the summit. This small sports unit is rewarded with a 360 degree panoramic view of the Alps and various lakes.
- The Dragon Trail: Directly accessible from the Panorama Gallery is this 10mins loop walk. With its peepholes it invites you to explore different perspectives of Lake Lucerne and its surroundings without having to climb up a viewpoint.

There are two options:

- Via Tunnel back to Hotel Pilatus-Kulm (10mins)
- Via «Chriesiloch» and climbing a steep ladder towards viewpoint Oberhaupt (15mins)
- **Flower Trail:** Hike through the wildflowers in direction Tomlishorn, with 200 info panels in German and English about plant species, blooming periods and Latin nomenclature. The trail is open June-October.
- **Tomlishorn Hike:** Continuation of the Flower Trail to the highest point of Mt. Pilatus, the Tomlishorn. 40 minutes per way. Look out for the colony of wild mountain ibexes that can frequently be spotted on this spectacular rim hike.
- **Dragon World:** Experience the dragon saga in the «Dragon World» on a fascinating tour in the Mythen Foyer on Pilatus Kulm at the end of the panorama gallery, heading down the stairs. The tour is designed interactively, with games and fascinating effects that invite you imagine the dragon stories of Mt. Pilatus even more vividly.







5.1.2 THE LARGEST ROPE PARK IN CENTRAL SWITZERLAND

In the Pilatus Rope Park you can practice your skills, jump into an abyss and build your courage on 10 different parcours with differing levels of difficulty. Great for young and old adventurers and families.

IN BRIFF

- 10 parcours with balance and climbing challenges as well as ziplines
- Easy to difficult
- Monkey Trees: climbing enthusiasts climb up to 14-meter-high platforms on selected trees
- Power fan: 20-meter free fall secured by a rope

FACTS:

- Located directly at Fräkmüntegg middle station
- No special knowledge or skills required
- Includes instructions for all visitors
- End of April until October
- Group booking possible
- Check the weather: Depending on the weather, the rope park may be closed for safety reasons or may have to be closed during operation
- Maximum 3-hour stay
- Minimum age is 8 years, minimum height is 120 cm, maximum weight per person is 120 kg

5.1.3 THE PILU ROPE PARK

The PILU Rope Park is a climbing adventure for children aged 4-8. It is equipped with 7 climbing stations and is perfect for gathering some first impressions of the sport.

IN BRIEF:

- For children aged 4-8
- 7 climbing stations

- Located directly at Fräkmüntegg middle station
- End of April until October
- Check the weather: Depending on the weather, the rope park may be closed for safety reasons or may have to be closed during operation







5.1.4 OTHER SUMMER ACTIVITIES AT FRÄKMÜNTEGG

The Dragon Glider, Treetop Path and the Drachenalp grill and kiosk have all been opened in summer 2019 to make your visit at Fräkmüntegg even more fun! The Drachenalp is a covered BBQ shelter with a kiosk where you can stock up to make your own BBQ at the available BBQ facilities. The Drachenalp is also the arrival point of the Dragon Glider.

IN BRIEF:

- Dragon Glider a gentle ride through the forest
 - Fly Line with comfortable paraglider seat
 - No skills required
 - Max. 12 km per hour
 - 500 meters in length
 - Exit point at the Drachenalp
- Treetop Path
 - Wide walking ropes lead you from tree to tree
 - Protected by safety nets
 - 13 platforms to hang out and learn about the forest and its inhabitants through various educational displays
- Drachenalp
 - Large covered BBQ area
 - Integrated kiosk

FACTS:

- Located at Fräkmüntegg middle station
- The Dragon Glider can be paid on site
- The Treetop Path is free of charge

5.1.7 THE DRAGON MOOR



IN BRIEF:

- Protected highland moors
- Information panels in German

- Barefoot trail

- Located directly at Krienseregg middle station
- Learn more about PILU in the small children's book available on spot.
- Open all year round
- Free of charge





5.1.8 PILATUS - A HIKER'S PARADISE

Hiking on Mt. Pilatus is a great way to enjoy nature and great views. The hiking trails range from easy to alpine, offering something for everyone from families, school groups and seniors to club outings and nature lovers.

IN BRIEF:

- Hikes from easy to alpine (from Kriens, Fräkmüntegg or Alpnachstad)
- Lots of short, panorama routes on Pilatus Kulm (between 10–40 minutes per hike) as well as a flower trail with information panels
- Well marked hiking trails that can be easily done without a guide
- Playing it safe: a hiking guide can be booked by Bucher Travel if desired (www.buchertravel.ch)

5.1.9 TRAILRUNNING



5.2.1 SLEDGING

You can sledge from Fräkmüntegg to Krienseregg on natural, snow-covered descents of varying lengths and difficulty levels.

IN BRIEF:

- Naturally snow-covered sledging slopes
- Runs: 3.2 km, medium to difficult and 4.8 km, easy
- Sledges can be rented on site

- Rental shop for helmets, children's seats and sledges
- Open from December to March (depending on snow conditions)
- Group reservations possible
- Deposit a credit card/ID for families and groups, liability rests with one person







5.2.2 SNOWSHOEING

Between Krienseregg and Fräkmüntegg there are three marked snowshoe trails that take you through snowy winter forests and over snowy glades.

IN BRIEF:

- 3 marked trails
- Trails between 3.3 and 5.4 km
- Snowshoes and poles can be rented on the spot

FACTS:

- Rental shop for snowshoes and poles
- Open from December to March (depending on snow conditions)
- Group reservations recommended from 10 or more participants

5.2.3 FONDUE FEAST

A regional cheese fondue can be enjoyed in the Cheminéé Saal of the Restaurant Pilatus-Kulm. It warms the heart and body.

IN BRIEF:

The fondue feast includes:

- Ascent and descent Kriens Pilatus-Kulm
- A portion of fondue and a small mixed salad

- At Restaurant Pilatus-Kulm
- November to March
- Reservations required







5.2.4 FONDUE GONDOLA

Float up into the air and feast on the delicious cheese fondue during the gondola ride from Kriens over Fräkmüntegg and back to Krienseregg. After the approximately 45-minute cheese feast, you will have numerous opportunities to discover Mount Pilatus. For example with a nice snowshoe hike, a sledge ride or a pleasant walk back to Kriens.

IN BRIEF:

- Included in the offer:
 - Day pass: Kriens Fräkmüntegg Kriens
 - Local cheese fondue including drinks (2.5dl white wine per person and mineral water)
 - Voucher for a coffee / tea at Restaurant Krienseregg or Fräkmüntegg

5.2.5 CHRISTMAS MARKET

Every year in November there is a Christmas market on top of Mt. Pilatus. The market has more than 40 stalls and is the highest market of its kind in Europe.

IN BRIEF:

- Highest Christmas market in Europe
- 3 days, from Friday afternoon to Sunday afternoon
- More than 40 market stalls
- Takes place mid-November

- On top of Mt. Pilatus
- Depending on the weather, you can ascend from Alpnachstad and Kriens



6. PILATUS RAILWAYS ARE TAKING CARE OF ITS ENVIRONMENT



Sustainability is very important to us and we try to balance the guest experience with sustainability in all areas of our business.

We place particular emphasis on the recycling process and consistently separate our waste (waste paper, glass, plastic, etc.). Whenever possible, we avoid waste and therefore do not use unnecessary packaging (e.g. for breakfast). Our disposable tableware is all biodegradable. In catering, we consider local suppliers and food when purchasing. We are a member of the United Against Waste association. This association is an industry association in the food sector and is actively committed to reducing food waste throughout the food industry. The common goal is to halve food waste in the industry. For an innovative and forward-looking industry.

Our water on Mount Pilatus is of excellent drinking water quality. For this reason we serve our own Pilatus water in glass bottles in our Pilatus-Kulm restaurant. The water is bottled on site and can be carbonated on request. Our hotel guests can enjoy spring-fresh drinking water directly from the tap in their room.

In addition, we pay great attention to consumables such as cleaning agents, guest amenities, etc., which we source organically and from sustainable production. We clean the rooms with special fibres and cloths and use cleaning agents that are quickly and easily degradable by the environment.

With the design of the new cogwheel railway, it is possible to reduce power consumption by 30 percent thanks to recuperation. We obtain external electricity from ecological production.

PILATUS-BAHNEN AG participates in the sustainability programme of Switzerland Tourism. At present, we have achieved Level II and are striving to achieve Level III as soon as possible.

The signet Swisstainable (fusion of the two terms «Swiss» and «Sustainable») is a visualisation that expresses the commitment to sustainability in the Swiss tourism industry. The signet will be integrated into the communication.

There are a lot of of legends related to the Pilatus massif. A very well-known story is the following: Once in autumn a young man on Mt. Pilatus fell into a deep cavern and found himself trapped between two dragons. But they did not harm him. When spring came, one of the two dragons left its winter grounds and flew away. The other one indicated that the time had come to move out. The dragon crawled to the exit, extended its tail toward the man, and pulled him out of the cavern.

7.2 HOW DID MT. PILATUS GET ITS NAME?

In the Middle Ages, Mt. Pilatus was called «Mons fractus» (broken mountain), Frakmon or Fräkmund. Only later was the name "Pilate", which probably already existed, associated with the Roman prefect in Jerusalem, Pontius Pilate. The legend was born that Pontius Pilate found his final resting place in the mountain lake called «Pilatussee», a body of water that has since silted up. Wherever they tried to bury Pilate's body before, there were heavy storms. For this reason, a high mountain like the Frakmont was chosen, where storms rage regularly anyway. Every Good Friday, the Roman prefect of Judaea is said to rise from his grave to sit in judgment in full regalia. Until the 16th century, the city council of Lucerne had forbidden anyone to climb the mountain under the threat of penalties. Pilate was not to be disturbed – and no tempests should be conjured up. If somebody risked enraging Pilate's ghost, for example, by throwing a stone into the lake, horrible storms would be stirred up that destroyed everything, as far down as to Kriens.

This legend was already known in Christian antiquity and became more widespread throughout the Middle Ages. Its popularity contributed greatly to the common name «Fräkmünt» being slowly but surely replaced by the name «Pilatus» in the 15th century. The name "Pilatus" was first documented in 1475.

7.3 QUEEN VICTORIA AND OTHER CELEBRITIES

In 1868, Queen Victoria rode her mule «Flora» up to Mt. Pilatus and spent the night with entourage in the Hotel Bellevue. The Hotel Pilatus-Kulm opened in 1890 and in 2010 the landmarked building was completely renovated. The «Queen Victoria» dining room was named in honor of the queen and is available to our hotel and group guests. Among the most illustrious guests at the Hotel Pilatus-Kulm was also Richard Wagner.

7.4 PILU THE MASCOT

PILU is the mascot of Mt. Pilatus and is very popular with both young and old. He is just as red as his «great-great-great-great-great-great-great-great grandfather» on the Pilatus logo. But he is muuuuuch more helpful and funnier! That is why you find him everywhere on Mt. Pilatus where something is going on. He is also available as a plush toy to take home and dream about the next trip to the wonderful natural landscape of Mt. Pilatus.
